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"Triumphant In Christ, Victorious In Life!"

<u>Sermon</u>: "Honor in Relationships" Sunday, September 24th, 2017 Read Luke 2:40, 52 (NKJV)

HONOR: (Read 1 Samuel 2:30; Proverbs 3:35)

- But, what is honor? The Hebrew word for "honor" is kabed. It literally gives us a picture of heaviness or weightiness. "To honor" is to give great weight, importance, worth, and significance to something or someone. On the contrary, the word dishonor gives us a picture of something 'light and trivial' one of mist or steam. When you honor people, you are conveying to them that they hold a certain weight in your heart. You are communicating to them that they are valuable to you. When you dishonor someone, you treat the relationship lightly, suggesting to them that they are neither valuable nor significant. This can be done many different ways, but many times it is done through your body language and your attitude. Dishonor stems from one's heart, and eventually reveals itself in one's actions. Remember, man looks at the outward actions, but God is looking at your heart. Do you honor those above you from your heart, or just with your words? Do you value their presence and wisdom? Take some time to think about what you can do to show honor toward them. I guarantee it will make a huge difference in your relationships. And, you will be favored for doing so.
- Learn how to honor others, especially those above you. Find out what pleases
 them, and become what they need for you to become. Being honorable is so important. There is no greater way of honoring a mentor then bowing your
 knee, for the sole purpose of bringing them pleasure. The Scriptures gives us
 several key truths to learn and receive when it comes to HONOR:
- #1) HONOR'S <u>CONDITIONS</u>: <u>Matthew 10:40-42 (NKJV)</u> "40" He who receives you receives Me, and he who receives Me receives Him who sent Me. 41 He who receives a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward. And he who receives a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward. 42 And whoever gives one of these little ones only a cup of cold water in the name of a disciple, assuredly, I say to you, he shall by no means lose his reward." Jesus outlines three facets, dimensions and directions of HONOR with should embrace relationally:
 - 1st Spiritual Pastors/Prophets (Leadership Those over us in the Lord)
 - **2nd Spiritual Peers** (Righteous man Those around us in the Lord)
 - 3rd Spiritual Protégés (Disciples Those under our care in the Lord)
