Sermon: “Redeemed With Precious Blood”

Ephesians 1:7 (NKJV) – “In Him we have **redemption through His blood**, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace”

Colossians 1:14 (NKJV) – “In whom we have **redemption through His blood**, the forgiveness of sins.”

- What is _____? It is what was our Lord Jesus Christ doing when He died for us on the Cross, shed His Precious Blood, was raised from the dead by God our Father and carried His very own Blood into the Heavenly Holy of Holies.
- What _____ did Christ pay for our sins and purchase our salvation?
- **1 Peter 1:18 – 19 (NKJV)** – “¹⁸ knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, ¹⁹ but with **the precious blood of Christ**, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.”

REDEMPTION THROUGH THE SON – JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD

Read Ephesians 1:7 – 10

- In this first chapter of Ephesians, we see three prominent things and powerful _____ we should embrace, grasp and comprehend: (1) We are _____ by the Father in Christ (2) We are _____ by the Son (Jesus Christ) and (3) We are _____ by the Holy Spirit.
- **REDEMPTION:** (Definition from Noah Webster's 1828 Dictionary):

- _____ **is an accomplished fact in Christ.** Jesus said, “**You shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free,**” - **John 8:32.** The _____ will not help you if you do not know it. Ignorance and Victory are impossible roommates.
 - You must _____ (by revelation) what God has done for you. Jesus called the Holy Spirit the Spirit of Truth. God wants you to be free. He has given you His Holy Spirit to show you things of Christ. When you don't _____ and perceive the truth of God that you are _____, you have been _____ then you worry, stress out, complain, get cynical, critical and sad about the negative things that come into your life.
- **What have we been redeemed and made free from?**
 - **1st** – _____: “...In Him we have **redemption** through his blood...” - **Ephesians 1:7;** **Romans 6:14 (NKJV)** – “For **sin shall not have dominion over you**, for you are not under law but under grace.”
 - **2nd** – _____: **Galatians 3:13 (NKJV)** – “¹³ Christ has **redeemed us from the curse of the law**, having become a curse for us (for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree”), ¹⁴ that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.”
 - There are three simple, yet powerful statements made in **Galatians 3:13.** Let's

take a closer look.

- **1st** - The first fact is that you are _____.
- **2nd** - The second is what you are redeemed from—the _____ of the law.
- **3rd** - The third is what you were redeemed by—Christ was made a _____ for you. In other words, Christ took your curse so you could go free.
- **3rd** – _____: **Psalms 107:2 (NKJV)** – “Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, Whom He has **redeemed from** the hand of the enemy; **Colossians 1:13 (NKJV)** – “He has **delivered us** from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love.”
- **4th** – _____: **Isaiah 51:11 (KJV)** – “Therefore **the redeemed of the LORD** shall return, and come with **singing** unto Zion; and **everlasting joy** shall be upon their head: they shall obtain **gladness and joy**; and sorrow and mourning shall flee away.”; **Isaiah 53:4** - “Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows...”
- **5th** – _____: **Read 2 Timothy 1:7 - 12 (NKJV)**
- Let’s unpack several things to consider in this passage:
- **1st – We are not to be _____!** **SHAME is the painful emotion created by a consciousness of guilt or shortcoming or impropriety.** Shame is fear-based and a byproduct of fear. There are two big types of SHAME: (1) Well-placed SHAME or (2) Misplaced SHAME (the kind you ought not to have).
 - Shame has a root and its sin! This SHAME mentioned by Paul through the Holy Spirit is misplaced SHAME. A shame and embarrassment to speak and testify of the Lord.
 - Secondly, this text says that if you feel shame that a friend of yours is in trouble (in this case: prison) for Jesus’ sake, then your shame is misplaced.
 - **Mark 8:38 (NKJV)** – “For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels.”
- **2nd – We are to share in the _____ of the Gospel.** (**Suffer** = means to undergo hardships or pain). **Read 1 Peter 4:16 (NKJV)** and **2 Timothy 2:3 (NKJV)** and **2 Timothy 3:12 (NKJV)**
- **3rd – God is able to KEEP what we _____ to Him!**
- Friends, you and I have been _____ from grief, mourning, sorrow and shame and we have to _____ it just like you have to resist the temptations to sin, the sickness or disease that tries to invade your body or Satan who tries to enter your life or family situations with his deceitful and destructive work. YOU ARE THE _____! You shouldn’t partake of anything but _____!
- **Jesus paid much too high a price for your freedom for you to stay bound.** It is an insult to God for you to stay in prison when Jesus paid the price for your release. Satan cannot hold you. Sin cannot hold you. The past cannot hold you.

ETERNAL REDEMPTION - GOD’S MASTERPIECE

Read Hebrews 9:11 – 14 (NKJV)

- **All that man needs is _____ in Christ.** The past, present, and future have been taken care of. The spirit, soul, and the body have been taken care of — all because of what Jesus has done for us. That means you are not trying to get it or struggling to get it. Jesus got it for you, so it is yours. You have it now. **Redemption is an accomplished fact in Christ.**
 - **Your redemption was legally purchased through the blood of Jesus.** His death and resurrection have established a new, universal fact for every man. Jesus purchased your freedom. **“You were not redeemed with silver and gold...but with the precious blood of Christ...” - 1 Peter 1:18,19**
 - **No amount of money could buy your release from Satan, sin, sickness, sorrow or the past.** **Only the blood of Jesus was legal payment for your freedom.** If Jesus paid so high a price for your release, you should not remain behind bars. The prison door is open. You can simply walk out when you see what God, in Christ, has done for you.

Declare these things right now: “Jesus Christ is my Lord, my Savior and my Redeemer! I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me.
