Hebrews 11:1 (NKJV) - "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

- MUST BE CONNECTED TO FAITH! Is it hopeful or hopeless around your house?
- Things we learn about ______ from God's Word: (1) Hope is the expectation of a greater future than current circumstances. (2) Hope is an anchor for our souls (mind, will, and emotions); it keeps you steady in challenging times. (3) Hope sets the tone of our conversations. It seasons our speech.
- **Bible** _____ is not just wishing and wanting something, but it is: <u>Joyful</u>, <u>confident</u>, <u>expectation</u> of good. You are <u>persuaded</u> of something that is true / truth; you are <u>expecting</u> something good and you are <u>excited</u> about it!

HOW TO HAVE SELECTIVE HEARING

 Friends, when you go back and study the term "evidence" as it is meant when <u>Hebrews 11:1</u> refers to the word, you will find it relates to a modern term found in legal terminology: <u>Deposition</u>.

- _____ in this context is a great word to use when defining faith. Faith isn't based on what your grandma knows, what your mom knows, or what your father, brother, or sister knows; faith is based on what you know.
- FAITH IS NOT A HAND-ME-DOWN THING. FAITH IS _____; IT IS WHAT YOU PERSONALLY KNOW. IT STARTS WITH YOU.
- Friends, our word is the only thing that counts as evidence. **Romans 4:21 (KJV)** talks about this and says we should be "And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform."
- When you are fully ______ of God's faithfulness to you, your faith will withstand the courtroom testimony. It will become irrefutable ______ of God and His goodness. Paul said it this way by the Holy Spirit... 2 Timothy 1:12 (NKJV) "For this reason I also suffer these things; nevertheless I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day."
- How do we get to this point in our faith? <u>Romans 10:17 (NKJV)</u> "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Why would God put such an emphasis on you hearing His Word? It's very simple: WORDS ARE MORE THAN ______; WORDS ARE ______. THEY ______THINGS.
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- But ______ can also become a problem when we listen to words containing something very dangerous: **fear and doubt**. Friends, we must be careful of what words are allowed to fill our heart and our home atmosphere.
- Matthew 12:33 37 (NKJV) "³³ "Either make the tree good and its fruit good, or else make the tree bad and its fruit bad; for a tree is known by its fruit. ³⁴ Brood of vipers! How can you, being evil, speak good things? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. ³⁵ A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good things, and an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things. ³⁶ But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the Day of Judgment. ³⁷ For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

- Mark 4:24 (NKJV) "Then He said to them, "Take heed what you hear. With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you; and to you who hear, more will be given." THE ______ YOU PLACE ON WHAT YOU HEAR IS THE ______ IT COMES BACK TO YOU. Put full value on what you hear from God's Word!

TESTIMONIES OF THE ELDERS

Hebrews 11:2 - 3 (NKJV) - "² For by it the elders obtained a good testimony.³ By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible."

- The phrase "by faith the elders..." is easy to ignore and skip over, but the Father God does not waste words. Within this statement are a few powerful principles, when can help you be a person of faith. Let's jump right in.
 - (1) Other people can inspire your faith. The life of faith is not lived or learned in a vacuum. Whenever anyone succeeds in their walk with God, it encourages us. (WHAT stories are inspiring your heart or your home?). Stories (particularly the one Jesus shared and communicated do two things: (1) They *paint* faith-filled *pictures* for our heart; and, (2) They *provide* clear *points* and *principles* for our heads.
 - (2) We learn what faith is by watching others. Most people learn by observation, association and assimilation (visual learners); their ability to process truth occurs as they see it. Every time we watch people live through difficult or trying times, we can learn from them. (PARENTS: what family rating and faith rating would give your FAITH on display in our home?)

- (3) It takes faith from the abstract into everyday life. _______ is never to be isolated to a Sunday Morning church service; it is to be a part of everyday of the week. Faith is not just to work out of our ______, but, work in our ______ and in our _____.
- (4) We can pick up the nuances of believing in God.
- \circ (5) See from people who are farther along in life that faith is worth it.
- **(6) It reminds us whatever God does for others He will do for us.** God doesn't play favorites; what He will do for one He will do for everyone.
- **Hebrews 11:3 (NKJV)** "By faith we understand that the **worlds** were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible."
 - The word "<u>world</u>," however, had another connotation. The word also meant "ages," or "time." Using "<u>world</u>" declared one of the greatest concepts of faith:
 - LIFE MAY ______, AND TIMES MAY ______, BUT GOD DOES NOT. No matter how much things change, God has always been there for individuals who believe in Him.
- **Hebrews 11:4 (NKJV)** "By faith Abel offered to God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts; and through it he being dead still speaks."
- Our first elder of faith is _____, who exemplifies faith through his ______.
 - **<u>4:1 5</u>**. Three parts of Abel's worship help us unpack the story of his faith.
 - (1) Listen. We should always interpret the Old Testament testimonies in the light of New Testament truth. We look at <u>Genesis 4</u> in light of <u>Romans 10:17 (NKJV)</u> "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing the word of God."
 - **(2) Learn.** Just because we hear something doesn't always mean we learn it. Abel listened, but also learned he needed to be covered, and it needed to involve an animal. Abel learned from this, and understood animals were key to sacrifices and worship. Just as an animal was sacrificed to physically cover Adam and Eve, an animal sacrifice was required to cover man spiritually; that is, until Jesus became a living sacrifice.
 - **(3) Live.** Abel took the first and the best to sacrifice to God. Abel sets the precedent for us giving our best to God. Our best effort is what God accepts and loves.
 - THE FIRST EXAMPLE OF FAITH IS NOT ABOUT US ______ SOMETHING FROM GOD; IT IS ABOUT ______ GOD SOMETHING.
- The second elder of faith demonstrates faith to us in his ______ with God. Enoch's example shows a valuable lesson about faith. Faith isn't just about what you're *saying*; it's about what you're *doing*.
 - YOUR WALK OF FAITH MUST BE ______ THAN YOUR LIPS. IT MUST SHOW UP IN YOUR _____!
 - Abel's example was about <u>saving</u> faith. His faith was about offering and acknowledging a sacrifice from God. Enoch's faith was about <u>transforming</u> faith: once you're saved, God wants to transform you.
 - Transformation is the second step after salvation.
 - (1) A walk with God is public, not private. His walk distinguished him so people were aware.
 - (2) It was a step, not a leap. Enoch walked in faith. "Enoch walked faithfully with God 300 years..." <u>Genesis 5:22b (NKJV</u>). Faith isn't doing anything other than taking the next step. Faith just means taking one more step.
 - (3) It was today, not tomorrow. If Enoch is an example for us of any principle of faith, it is if you just handle today, you'll make it through tomorrow.
 - (4) Walking comes down to you. You have no control over anyone else's walk. Enoch shows us what it's like to make a personal decision to walk with God.
 - (5) Walking means you are with God. Everyone wants to know, "Well is God going to be with me?" The real question is are you going to be with God?
- Our third elder of faith who demonstrates the next progression of our list is Noah. <u>Hebrews 11:7 (NKJV)</u>
 – "By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for
 the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness
 which is according to faith."
- Noah demonstrates the _____ OF FATH. Noah shows us in four ways how faith is not a well-kept secret.
 - **(1) Faith will not always be popular.** FAITH IS NOT A ______ ISSUE. In fact, most people will think it is out of style. Can you live faith if it's not popular? Will you share and show your faith even if you get persecuted?

- (2) Faith always stands out in a crowd. Faith makes you look different. It changes how you think.
- (3) Faith is about how God sees you, not how people see you. "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord." <u>Genesis 6:8 (NKJV)</u>. Noah demonstrates faith by disregarding what others thought of him.
- (4) Faith requires you to do what others do not do. What God told Noah to do was out of the ordinary to say the least, but Noah obeyed and did what no one else would do. Noah was willing to stand out for his faith. That's what being a witness means. It means people notice your faith. YOUR FAITH SHOULD MAKE YOU _____ DIFFERENT AND _____ DIFFERENTLY.
- If we can learn to _____ like Able, to _____ with God like Enoch, and to be a ______ like Noah, we will be well on our way to building up our faith. We will be on our way to building and leaving a legacy of ______ and _____ of Faith in and for our _____.
